
Auckland City Mission Food Parcel Demand (2008-2020)



This graph shows the number of food parcels distributed by the Auckland City Mission each financial year from 2008-09 to 2019-20. The latest figures include only 5 months of the Covid-19 period.

- Between 2008-09 and 2019-20, food parcel demand **increased almost 6.5 fold**, from 5,329 to 34,120.
- Since the last financial year (2018-19), the Auckland City Mission has seen roughly a **30** percent increase in food parcel demand.
- In August, the <u>Auckland City Mission reported that</u> demand had **increased by 175 percent** during the March lockdown compared to the same period in the previous year.

While food bank data is not a precise measure of food insecurity, it is a barometer of poverty that highlights inadequate incomes for an increasing number of New Zealanders. The Covid-19 pandemic has exacerbated this existing trend.
